Background

Overview

League One Premier is the standards-based, soccer league of Ontario Soccer in which you will be assisting the delivery of two to three (2 - 3) training sessions and one (1) game per week. You will also work in conjunction with the Head Coach to achieve a high level of player retention while implementing a proactive and attractive brand of soccer in alignment with the Club's Technical Vision.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist training for an League One Premier team that includes two - three (2-3) training sessions per week (starting in December 2021) and one (1) game per week (May – October, 2022)
- Utilize coaching resources and software to help plan and manage training sessions and game-play
- Work with the Head Coach to deliver training session aligned to the League One Premier curriculum
- Assist with match preparation meetings and analysis with the team;
- Attend League One Premier meetings and CPD events as required;
- Help manage aspects such as the implementation of Mental Training, Player Monitoring and Video Feedback, as requested by the Head Coach;

- 3+ years' experience as a coach within a club
- An understanding of the development phases of youth players and optimal training and performance practices
- Understanding of the Ontario Player Development League practices and standards
- Knowledge of and support for the Canadian Soccer Association's Long-Term Player Development model
- Ability to act, implement and follow the WMSC's core values
- An ability to think and plan strategically
- Strong communication skills and an ability to convey messages to players and club staff
- Demonstrably support the technical and strategic imperatives of Waterloo United in relation to the player development pathway and be team players;



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Work collaboratively with other coaches within Waterloo's development pathway to League 1;
